An exhibition about the Graham Sea Training School, which was based in what is now Paradise House, will be on display at the Centre shortly.



December 16th 2014 - Bombardment Centenary



For the 100th anniversary of the Bombardment of Scarborough by the German cruisers *Derfflinger* and *Von Der Tann*, we are planning a brand new exhibition. Although the anniversary is over twenty months away, we are already gathering materials for this

In 1977, Yorkshire TV's *Calendar* showed a documentary about the 1914 bombardment, and we managed to contact David Mould, the programme's producer, who now lives in the USA. He has kindly sent us a video of the programme segment, together with a collection of photographs, some of which have not been seen before. All these will be on display in the exhibition.

In addition, we are also looking for the loan of other souvenirs, letters and other relics of the bombardment. We already have a 7 PM edition of the London *Evening Star* for December 16th 1914, which has the headline "*German 'Cut & Run' Raid. Shells on 3 Towns*".

The picture opposite is of a small (less than 1" high) fragment of the copper driving band from a German shell, which has been made to fit on a watch fob, and engraved with the words "Scarbro 1914".

Did you know...?

All popular histories of the bombardment claim that the Germans fired 'around 500 shells' into the town.

In fact, the official German Naval Archives show that 333 'large calibre' (11" and 12" shells) and 443 'medium calibre' shells were fired – a total of 776!

How many of these landed in open country outside the town? How many of them didn't explode on impact and are still out there waiting to be found?
