### **Maritime History Course**

The SMHC has teamed up with the Workers' Educational Association (WEA) to deliver a ten evening Maritime History Course starting in September 2013. The course will be held on Wednesday evenings from 6.30pm to 8.30pm in Scarborough. We need to recruit a minimum of 12 adults for the course to run and it will be free to anyone on benefits or income support.

Topics covered will include: the history and development of the harbour; shipwrecks and shipbuilding on the Yorkshire coast; tunny and herring fishing; 1914 bombardment; the Titanic; the history of yachting; maritime superstitions and folklore.

The course will give people the chance to learn more about Scarborough's fascinating past. There are no exams or homework and WEA staff will be on hand to help and advise if participants want to do more research on any of the topics. # Fish, Chips and Entertainment



#### **HMS Esk**

A WW2 prisoner's war camp diary was recently donated to us along with a photograph album from 1931. Herbert Vaughn was in the Royal Navy and served on HMS Bridgewater off China from 1931 to 1934 and then on HMS Esk in 1940. HMS Esk hit a mine off the Dutch Coast and sank. We have put the thrilling first hand account of the sinking of HMS Esk, days spent in a life raft and then capture by the Germans, onto our website.
